2. 7½ shot or smaller shells *(Also available at Club)*

### **Directions:**

Route 322 West to Route 220 at Port Matilda. South on Route 220 approximately 10 miles to the traffic signal at the junction of Routes 350 and 220. Straight through the signal on old Route 220 (do not go left onto I-99). Travel approximately 1 mile, look for sign for Tyrone Sportsman Club on the right. Turn at sign, travel approximately ½ mile, turn left at sign for Club, continue 200 yards to the Club on right.

The Water Works Operators' Association of Pennsylvania is pleased to announce the partnering with PA DEP to sponsor a Water or Wastewater examination on August 4th, 2009.

The registration form and instructions can be secured by downloading from the WWOAP web site ([www.wwoap.org](http://www.wwoap.org)) or by calling John Poklembo, Education Chairman, at (717) 718-2960 for a mailed copy. Please read the instructions carefully. Application deadline is June 26th. In addition it is important that you include your client I.D., if you have one, and the Class of Certification that you are applying for.

You will have four hours to take the exam and you may mix both water and wastewater examinations. By noting the average time anticipated for each exam, you can determine the "safe" number of exams to apply for. Please note that if you don't have time to complete one or more exams that the incompleteness will be counted as a failure.

Small system operators need to understand that the Dc exam qualifies you to operate a small groundwater system with disinfection only. The Dn exam is for a system with no treatment. These two exams cannot be combined with any other exam. If you use additional chemical treatment or filtration in your facility, you need to take Part 1 and the appropriate subclasses.

Lastly, you do NOT need the criminal history record report to take the exam. This will be required upon DEP notice that you passed and at which time the fee per examination session will be invoiced to you.

Seating is limited and a letter confirming that you have been registered will be sent to you prior to the exam date.
